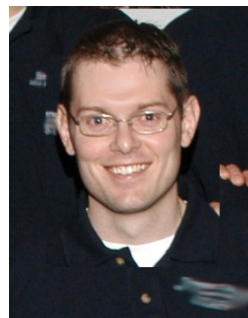
I have been an active member of ASJA for the past two years and during that time have also been working at Johnson & Wales University.

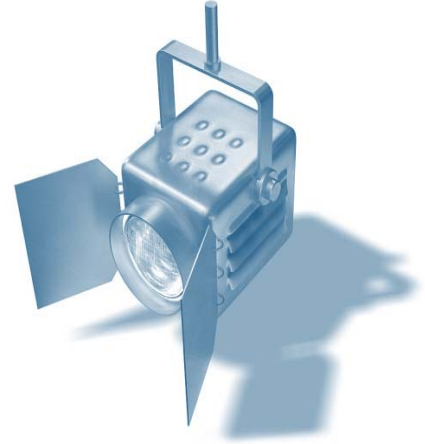
